


Lubbins Park's English Curriculum: Literacy Tree

At Lubbins Park we teach our reading and writing lessons through a platform called Literacy Tree.

Literacy Tree is an award-winning, book-based platform that promotes a thematic approach to the teaching of primary English.

Our English curriculum is designed to immerse children in a literary world, creating strong levels of engagement in a range of meaningful and authentic texts that are used to inspire reading and writing.

Throughout their time at Lubbins Park, children will become critical readers and will acquire an authorial style as they encounter a wide-range of authors and a variety of fiction, non-fiction and poetry.



As Literacy Tree is a whole-school approach, children will explore at least 100 texts and experience over 75 unique authors during their time from nursery to year 6. This does not include the additional texts that they will listen to during our daily ‘Talk and Tales’ sessions!

Our curriculum provides complete coverage of all National Curriculum expectations for writing composition, reading, comprehension, grammar, punctuation and vocabulary. All of our lessons lead to purposeful application within a wide variety of written outcomes, allowing our children to become confident with writing for all purposes.
